




# **Sanctuary Retiling**


It is written by Ellen G. White who has tasted and found that God is good, and who was in communion with God and the study of His word. She shared that the secret of the Lord is with them that fear Him, and that He will show them His covenant (GC iii 5)




The Great Controversy in its enlarged form was published in the early summer of 1888 by both the Review and Herald and the Pacific Press and later on by the Southern Publishing Association. As explained by Mrs. White on page 12, it was this that led her to plan a slight revision of the book. It was but natural that any change in the text of an E. G. White book long in circulation would call for a discussion of inspiration and its bearing upon the book in question. The statements comprising this document supply the information given at the time the new edition of The Great Controversy appeared in 1911. (Arthur L. White – The Great Controversy New Edition)

The Great Controversy (first chapter ) opens with the sad closing scenes of Jerusalem's history, the city of God's chosen, after her rejection of the Man of Calvary, who came to save us. It continues onward along the great highway of the nations, to points us to the:

- persecutions of God's children in the first centuries;
- the great apostasy which followed in His church;
- the world-awakening of the reformation, in which some of the great principles of the controversy are clearly manifest;
- the awful lesson of the rejection of right principles by France;
- the revival and exaltation of the Scriptures, and their beneficent, life-saving influence;
- the religious awakening of the last days;
- the unsealing of the radiant fountain of God's word, with its wonderful revelations of light and knowledge to meet the threatening up-springing of every delusion of darkness (GC iii 7).

Last of all, we are told of the eternal and glorious victory of good over evil, right over wrong, light over darkness, joy over sorrow, hope over despair, glory over shame, life over death, and everlasting, long-suffering love over vindictive hate (GC iv 2)

# Seventh-day Adventists Fundamental Belief Number 8: THE GREAT CONTROVERSY

The Great Controversary forms a part of our fundamental beliefs and reads as follows:

All humanity is now involved in a great controversy between Christ and Satan regarding the character of God, His law, and His sovereignty over the universe. This conflict originated in heaven when a created being, endowed with freedom of choice, in selfexaltation became Satan, God's adversary, and led into rebellion a portion of the angels. He introduced the spirit of rebellion into this world when he led Adam and Eve into sin. This human sin resulted in the distortion of the image of God in humanity, the disordering of the created world, and its eventual devastation at the time of the global flood, as presented in the historical account of Genesis 1-11. Observed by the whole creation, this world became the arena of the universal conflict, out of which the God of love will ultimately be vindicated. To assist His people in this controversy, Christ sends the Holy Spirit and the loyal angels to guide, protect, and sustain them in the way of salvation. (Gen. 3; 6-8; Job 1:6-12; Isa. 14:12-14; Ezek. 28:12-18; Rom. 1:19-32; 3:4; 5:12-21; 8:19-22; 1 Cor. 4:9; Heb. 1:14; 1 Peter 5:8; 2 Peter 3:6; Rev. 12:4-9.)

"When I learned that the Great Controversy must be reset, I determined that we would have everything closely examined, to see if the truths it contained were stated in the very best manner, to convince those not of our faith that the Lord had guided and sustained me in the writing of its pages."

All humanity is now involved in a great controversy between Christ and Satan regarding the character of God, His law, and His sovereignty over the universe. This conflict originated in heaven when a created being, endowed with freedom of choice, in self-exaltation became Satan, God's adversary.

The official Ellen G. White Estate web site views the 1888 version as the original "Great Controversy," with the 1911 edition being the only revision.

While working to complete the book in 1884, White wrote, "I want to get it out as soon as possible, for our people need it so much.... I have been unable to sleep nights, for thinking of the important things to take place.... Great things are before us, and we want to call the people from their indifference to get ready."

In the 1911 edition preface, the author states the primary purpose of the book to be "to trace the history of the controversy in past ages, and especially so to present it as to shed a light on the fastapproaching struggle of the future." Demonstrated in diagram on the next page.

# **Summary of Chapter 1**

Chapter 1 of "The Great Controversy" by Ellen G. White is titled "The Destruction of Jerusalem. It discusses the fall of Jerusalem and the destruction of the Temple in AD 70. It also examines the events leading up to the tragedy and the underlying causes of



the calamity. The chapter, begins with a description of the city of Jerusalem and the Temple, which was considered the most sacred place on earth by the Jewish people.

However, despite the apparent religious devotion of the people, the city was filled with corruption and sin, and the leaders of the nation had turned away from God. This spiritual decay ultimately led to the fall of



Jerusalem. Ellen G. White explains, Jesus had foreseen the destruction of Jerusalem and had wept over the city, lamenting the spiritual blindness and disobedience of its people. She quotes the Bible, where Jesus says, "If you, even you, had only known on this day what would bring you peace--but now it is hidden from your eyes" (Luke 19:42, NIV). Also highlighted is the love of Jesus for the people of Jerusalem, as He wept over the city and lamented the destruction that would come upon it. The author goes on to explain that Jesus' sorrow over Jerusalem was not just a reflection of His love for the Jewish people, but it was also a warning to all of us about the consequences of spiritual neglect and disobedience. She urges readers to heed this warning and turn to God, lest they suffer a similar fate.

# **Immune System Builder For Buoyant Health**

- Exercise half an hour for at least 4 days each week
- Water drink at least eight glasses each day. Water should be at room temperature. Do not drink icy-cold liquids.
- Sunshine stay in the direct rays of the sun for at least half an hour for 6 days each week

- Air deeply breathe in and exhale clean air for five minutes at least 4 times each day

# **Fundamental Beliefs**

Summary of the 28 Fundamental Beliefs of the Seventhday Adventist Church.

- In God the Father, Jesus Christ the Son and the in Holy Spirit. (Hebrews 1:1-3; John 1:1-3; Hebrews 7:25).
- In Regeneration and new birth, through the acceptance of the Gospel. (John 3:1-7, 11).
- That The Bible is the inspired Word of God. (2 Timothy 3:16, 17).
- That The second coming of Christ is very near and will be audible & visible to all, literal, personal, and full of fanfare. (John 14:1-3; Acts 1:11; Matthew 24:30, I Thessalonians. 4:16).
- That Immortality is the gift of God, that the dead are in an unconscious state, and there will be a general resurrection. (Romans 6:23; I Corinthians 15: 50-54; 1 Thessalonians 4:16, 17).
- That The law of the Ten Commandments is the standard of righteousness by which all will be judged. (James 2:10-12).
- That The original Seventh-day Sabbath has never been changed by Divine authority and therefore all Christians are under obligation to keep it holy. (Genesis 2:2-3; Acts 13:14, 44; 17:2; Luke 23:54-56).
- In Support of the Gospel through tithes and offerings. (Malachi 3:8-11; John 3:23, Acts 8:36-39; I Corinthians 9:14).
- In Baptism by immersion. (Mark 1:9, 10; Romans 6:3-5).
- In The Ordinance of Humility and the Lord's Supper. (John 13:4-17; 1 Corinthians 11:23-26).
- In The gift of the Holy Spirit, including the gift of the Spirit of Prophecy. (Ephesians 4:8-11; Revelation 12:17 & 19:10).
- In Discarding unhealthy practices, such as the use of intoxicants, tobacco, unclean meats, etc. (Leviticus 11:1-11; Proverbs 23:29-32; 1 Corinthians 3:16, 17; Isaiah 66: 15-17).




